DEAN BECKER

called as a witness, being first duly sworn,
was examined and testified as follows:

EXAMINATION

BY MR. WADLEY:

Q. Mr. Becker, could you give your full name and address and contact information for the record.

A. Dean Harold Becker, [REDACTED], Bountiful. Cell phone is [REDACTED], and if you need to contact me by e-mail it's [REDACTED].

Q. My name is Daniel Wadley and I am the trial counsel for the Commission in connection with this case recently brought against APS and Mr. DeYoung. I understand that you have been a practicing attorney in the past.

A. Yes.

Q. You're familiar with depositions?

A. Yes.

Q. How depositions go?

A. Yes.

Q. I'll be asking you certain questions. I

6 THE WITNESS: Okay. Judson was very
7 reluctant to tell me this, but he kept everything
8 close to the vest about his discussions with
9 Mr. DeYoung and Mr. Wheeler, Max Wheeler, who was the
10 white-collar criminal attorney that Curtis eventually
11 hired after the SEC was starting to get more intense
12 in their quest for records and so on, which I didn't
13 really have a lot to do with, or I didn't have
14 anything to do with.

15 MR. GAYLORD: Can I interrupt you, if you
16 don't mind, just because I want to make sure we're
17 clear. The conversation you're talking about is with
18 Mr. Judson and yourself, not a meeting with
19 Mr. Judson, Mr. Wheeler or Mr. DeYoung present?

20 THE WITNESS: Correct. Mr. Pitts and I
21 shared an office. And Mr. Pitts indicated that
22 before a deposition that Curtis was to take at the
23 SEC, that Curtis was very nervous, and indicated that
24 a large sum of money, \$20 million or so, was missing
25 on the books.
